





Student Body Characteristics



Based on the 2023 August Census, Good News Lutheran College had a student population of 1408 student in 2023. As the College continues through its largest expected growth phrase, upward trend in enrolments are expected. The projected enrolment for 2024 is 1460 students across the Tarneit and Mambourin Campuses.

At Census in 2023, the composition of the student population was 51.42% female and 48.58% male. Good News had nil students identifying as indigenous. Students with educational needs have Individual Learning Plans to help focus learning on their specific needs. Good News also provides additional support for several other students. Students are supported, depending on their level of need, with four tiers of programs:

- 1. Targeted specific skills instruction supported within the classroom.
- 2. Modified learning programs within the classroom.
- 3. Intensive instructional support withdrawn from the classroom in programs such as Early Maths Understanding, Fountas & Pinnell and Reading Recovery.
- 4. Additional support within the classroom.

Year 12 2023 Post-Secondary Pathways Vocational Education






